

**GUIDELINES FOR APPLYING FOR
AN EXOTIC ANIMAL PERMIT**

No person shall own or keep any exotic animal without first applying to and receiving from the City Manager a permit to do so. The procedure for acquiring an Exotic Animal Permit is as follows:

- There is no fee for the permit at this time. A fee shall be due and payable at the time of issuance of the permit and shall be a prerequisite of such issuance.
- A written application must be filed with the City Manager's office.
- After the application has been received, the City Manager shall make any investigation he/she deems proper. The application will be approved if he/she finds the following:
 - (1) the keeping of the exotic animal will not violate any ordinance or other regulation of the City or State
 - (2) keeping and maintenance will not endanger the peace, health, or safety of persons in the immediate vicinity or the City as a whole;
 - (3) the premises and housing are to be kept in clean and sanitary condition and any exotic animal will not be subject to suffering, cruelty or abuse;
 - (4) the applicant has not had a permit revoked within a year prior to the date of application;
 - (5) the keeping and maintenance of the exotic animal does not constitute a public nuisance.
- A renewal permit shall be obtained by the holder of the permit each succeeding year renewal. If complaints are received once a permit has been issued, the permit approval is subject to review and reconsideration by the City Manager.
- Whenever a new exotic animal or collection is added so as to exceed the maximum number permitted, a new permit must be secured and a new fee paid subject to exceptions listed in Title 8, Chapter 8.20 of the UCMC.
