



Update regarding COVID-19 Shelter in Place Order and Union City Community & Recreation

The health and safety of our residents, businesses, employees, and visitors is our top priority and we continue to be proactive in helping to ensure the health and safety of the community.

We encourage the community to stay calm, safe, and share information online with your friends and neighbors.

In order to slow the spread of COVID-19 to the maximum extent possible, the City of Union City is following the Alameda County Public Health Department's order to Shelter in Place. This order has been in effect as of Monday, March 16, 2020 and will continue to be in effect until Tuesday, April 7, 2020 (or until it is extended, rescinded, superseded, or amended in writing by the Public Health Officer).

In response, the Union City Community & Recreation Services has CLOSED all facilities to the public for non-essential services. Below you will find a list of services that have been suspended and services that will still be provided.

Services Temporarily Suspended

- All community centers and satellite facilities are closed to the public as of Monday, March 16, 2020.
- All classes, activities and programs have been cancelled or postponed until after April 7, 2020, except for the Senior Nutrition program and CAREavan.
- All rentals of facilities and parks have been cancelled through the end of April.
- All ballfield rentals have been cancelled through April 7, 2020.
- In conjunction with Public Works, all park restrooms will remain locked starting Thursday, March 19, 2020.

Services Being Provided

- The Senior Nutrition program is providing lunches to-go Monday through Thursday at the Ruggieri Senior Center. An interest list for delivered lunches is being created for seniors who are expressing interest in receiving lunch yet are unable to come to the center to pick up the meal during the virus crisis. - The CAREavan program is now operating 4 nights per week at the Ruggieri Center, 2 nights at Our Lady of the Rosary Church and 1 night at Brown Temple.
- The Farmer's Market at Old Alvarado/Cesar Chavez Park will be open to the public Saturday, March 21, 2020. Steps being taken include:
 - No sampling of food
 - No seating or entertainment provided
